

A Message from the BOE

Glenn Hammond Curtiss Memorial...(what?)

People are rightly concerned about the future of the Curtiss School. Our neighboring districts have had trouble with decommissioned schools. Curtiss is a grand, old memorial landmark on a picturesque campus in the heart of the village which anchors our district. Many of us, including board members, have learned there.

What will happen to Curtiss? The honest answer is that we don't completely know. This answer isn't very satisfying to the community or to the board, but this answer is honest, and this answer doesn't change what we do know.

Moving to one campus at Main Street by 2010 is driven by educational, demographic and economic conditions. We can best serve the educational needs of our children by moving services to one campus. Enrollment is down. We don't need two schools. National, state, and local economies are down. State aid is down. Mandates are up. Costs are up. Unemployment is up. Our community is supportive but hurting. Former potential tenants for Curtiss (BOCES, community colleges) also have economic challenges.

The board faces the same kinds of decisions which we all face--not choosing between what we want and what we don't want but choosing between what we don't want and something worse.

For now, Curtiss is a school. After that, it will be district property if not a school property). After that, we don't completely know.

No one, especially on this Board, wants to see Curtiss become a liability. We are, as always, willing to hear suggestions. We are prepared to choose the best of our available options.


New College Theatre Course Offered to Juniors & Seniors

The ACE courses of Corning Community College are expanding at HCS to include Introduction to Theatre (THEA 1010), a fall semester course at the High School which also earns college credit. This is the third ACE course taught by Joanne LeClair, who holds a B.A. in Dramatic Literature and Theatre Arts, as well as a M.A. in Theatre Arts which qualify her to teach this course at the college level through the ACE program.

Students will be exposed to elements of production and design concept, acting techniques, and theatre history as they pertain to play analysis. Students will read several plays from different eras and explore their production possibilities in terms of set and lighting design, special effects, costumes, make up, stage blocking and acting techniques. They will "produce" scenes from these plays, and gain additional public performance experience in designing puppets and presenting one act plays to student

guests from UPK – 4th Grades. So save some of those old clothes, scraps of material and yarn; you never know if it will come in handy for a costume or puppet design! The class will take advantage of visiting Corning Community College and attend a guest lecture there, and they will also be required to assist in Drama Club's fall produc-

If you are a junior or senior and want to take this course, but have not yet signed up for it, call the high school office and speak with Mr. Derr. It's not too late to see if it will fit into your schedule.

Duane C. Doherty fought as an army captain in WWII, and as a major in Korea. Three times he received the Silver Star for "gallantry in action." He also received two Bronze Stars, and was wounded four times.

Musician First Class Stephen Carrasas was playing the national anthem on the USS Honolulu when it was attacked at Pearl Harbor. He served in thirteen combat engagements and was on the USS Helena when that ship was sunk in night action at Kula Gulf; he spent hours in the water in the crossfire of a major fleet battle. Never fully recovering, he died September 27, 1948.

All inductees received plaques displaying their pictures and accomplishments that will be hung on the walls of HCS.


