



### **D-Day Paratrooper Speaks at HCS**

On Thursday, January 14 students in the global studies classes at HCS received a real treat. World War II Paratrooper Richard Falvey shared with the classes a first person account of the D-Day invasion.

At age 21, Mr. Falvey was one of 13,000 paratroopers who jumped into Normandy, France at 1am on the morning of June 6, 1944. The line of planes that held these paratroopers was 300 miles long and nine planes wide. He relived the moments before he and his fellow paratroopers made their jump. He remembers it being very quiet when suddenly "all hell broke loose" and they came under anti-aircraft fire. A plane a few miles ahead of his burst into flames and fell to the ground. Mr. Falvey provided a very moving account of the moments leading up to and after he and his fellow paratroopers made their jump, including what was going through his head, what he saw and how he felt. At the conclusion of his talk, Mr. Falvey fielded several questions from the students.

Mr. Falvey was born in 1921 in Yonkers, NY. He received his basic training at Camp Toccoa in Georgia, a site made famous by the *Band of Brothers* film. Mr. Falvey currently lives in Hammondsport and actively shares his WWII experiences at many venues.
