## HCS Ranked One of America's Best

HammondSport Junior-Senior High has been listed in the *US News and World Report* annual ranking of the best high schools in the nation! Over 21,000 schools across the United States were analyzed by *Standards and Poor*, but only 1,750 were recognized. Of the 1,041 schools in New York State, only 122 met the standards to be listed as one of the top high schools in the nation.

The process used to determine the best high schools looked at how well the schools served their entire student body, using state proficiency standards as the benchmarks. For HCS, the ranking was based upon our student body scoring

statistically better than the average student in New York State on the ELA (English Language Arts) and math state exams taken during the 2007-2008 school year.

*US News and World Report* also derives a college readiness index based upon AP (Advanced Placement) participation and IB (International Baccalaureate) Participation. Though HCS does offer AP courses, our students are not required to take the AP exam which precluded us from consideration for the Silver Medal and Gold Medal categories.

This is the first year HCS has received this designation from *US News and World Report* which publishes the list yearly. "Mr. Rounds and the high school students, faculty and staff have worked very hard to achieve this award," said Superintendent Kyle Bower. "With a continued focus on effective instruction that meets the needs of all learners, this national recognition is only the beginning of more great things to come."



Every holiday season the members of the Hammondspport Community Services Organization in conjunction with the local Food Pantry of Hammondspport and other service organizations organize holiday baskets for families in need within the Hammondspport School District. As is tradition, the Hammondspport Teacher's Association heads up a coordinated effort for the teachers to contribute as well.

Large boxes were placed in each of the three faculty main offices for Primary School, Curtiss School and Jr./Sr. High School teachers, and invitations are sent out to the teachers to bring in non-food items to supplement the baskets handed out to local families during the holiday season. Each year teachers have brought in such items as personal soap, shampoo and conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, brushes, hand soap, shaving cream, razors, toilet paper, paper towels, dish or laundry detergents, plastic wrap, aluminum foil, or any other non-food household item. The food pantry relies on these contributions, since these are items that are not available through the Food Bank of the Southern Tier. The food bank would need to use their own funds to purchase these items.

The Teacher's Association is pleased to help out the local food pantry and support the needs of our families and community. Also, many thanks to the members of the Class of 2010 who gave their time to help load the holiday gift baskets onto Mercury Inc. trucks for distribution to locations in the Wayne and Pulteney areas. 

# Banana Splits

Banana Splits is a peer support group for children whose families are in transition as a result of separation, divorce, remarriage or death. The major goal is to help children regain a feeling of stability by confronting the crisis of divorce or remarriage and learning to live with it. Through peer support of other students who also share feelings of loss and change, the children try to help each other solve the problems present in many "splits".



Through drawings, specialized projects, discussions, humor and books, children are helped to face hurts and change what they can in order to return to the full time job of being a child.

This year first through sixth grade students will meet in grade level groups every week at lunchtime. The sessions are approximately thirty to forty-five minutes long with students eating lunch and then moving into projects. Groups can range in size from four students up to a maximum of ten. Attendance is on a voluntary basis.

## 2009 Grads Share College Experiences


