Hammondsport Central School District (HCSD) Community:

As you most likely read in the Special Budget Issue of Laker Lines for 2018-19, the School Board Members continue to focus on the Value Proposition Statement that communicates the unique benefits of a HCS education for students, families and the community at large.

That Value Proposition Statement is as follows:

Hammondsport Central School District leverages the benefits of a PreK – Grade 12 campus located in the heart of a small community where relationships make a difference. We are/will:

Focused on sustainability and strategic fiscal responsibility

With this direction in mind and the approval of our latest Capital Project in Dec. 2017, our official New York State property tax cap calculates out to be 4.36%. However, the HCSD Board feels that this increase would not be prudent and with some carefully thought out expense trimming in other areas we are going to the community with a tax levy increase of 1.98% inclusive of a \$175,000 interest payment built into the '19 – '20 budget and being the largest new component of the budget.

The HCSD Board believes that the proposed budget reflects the wants and needs of the school community and in a financially responsible way. The Board also appreciates the continued support of the Hammondsport Central School District.

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2019-2020 by the qualified voters of the Hammondsport Central School District, Steuben County, New York, will be held on Tuesday, May 21, 2019 between the hours 12:00pm and 8:00pm, prevailing time in the High School Gymnasium, at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot.

Capital Outlay Project for 2019-2020

The District is preparing to outfit all classroom spaces with interactive flat panels which will replace current classroom projectors, whiteboards, and other outdated classroom display technology.

Preparation work began in twenty nine rooms with the capital outlay project in 18-19 as electrical and data network access were redesigned in preparation for display installation in 19-20. The 19-20 project will focus on the remaining individual room upgrades in the areas needed to prepare for the installation of the new, wall mounted technology in 20-21in the remaining rooms. Total cost of project cannot exceed \$100,000. District receives \$56,700 back in building aid the following year each year a fully aidable project is completed.
