Thoughts from the Superintendent's Desk...

The other day in the hallway I found myself about ten feet behind two of our Kindergarten boys. For about the first few feet they were talking quietly and giggling back and forth. Both of the boys are great kids who have been doing well all year, and they were having no problem 'navigating' the building and completing whatev-

er errand they had been sent on.

One boy was sporting some 'hat head' from his winter cap and still wearing his snow pants and snow boots. The other boy had on his 'school clothes' which consisted of relatively new shoes, jeans, and a sweater. Neither could have cared less about what they looked like. Neither knew much about the other except name and the fact they had the same teacher. Nothing much mattered except the topic of the moment and the fact that they were really enjoying each other's company.

As they walked I found myself thinking that I would love to see these two boys interacting the same way, in the same hallway, in twelve years when they are high school seniors. Where, after age five, does it change? Why does it change? What can I do as an adult in my position to show students that citizenship includes civility, and that sorting into social groups is a *choice*, not fate. Growing up is tougher than it has ever been before, and children have more responsibility at an earlier age than many of us could have handled. The world is more and more transparent, and it is becoming harder and harder to find the substance in which to base decisions. At some point bed head and boots determine that they don't belong with new shoes and sweaters and vice versa. The giggling becomes judgement, and Snapchat replaces most attempts at conversation.

We are lucky here at HCS to have great kids who care about each other. In today's world it's getting harder and harder to point students to models of courtesy, respect, and compassion. Thank you to the school community that supports our students through these challenging times, and gives our District the resources we need to help them. As the new year begins, I thought this message is the best place to start.

Hammondsport students placed in over six categories, including First Place in the Science Fair and Collaborative categories.

In an ongoing effort to better serve students and parents at Hammondsport Junior/Senior High School, all parents will be contacted by the office during the second semester with an opportunity to offer their input on the educational experience of their child (ren) to date. Please limit the use of electronic devices and screen time that is not educationally related to a reasonable amount—typically defined as less than two hours a day. Parents should remind their child(ren) to store their cellphones in their lockers between the hours of 7:45AM-2:20PM.


Public Notice Reminder

The manufacturing class

recently completed two Invasive Species Disposal Stations for the Keuka Lake Association. These two stations will be placed at the village boat launch and at Champlain Beach, respectively. They will be placed with signs which inform boaters on how to adequately check boats and trailers for invasive species like zebra mussels and harmful weeds. Boaters will be able to place invasive species debris into these containers so debris doesn't end up being transported from lake to lake spreading the problem. Mr. Lowin worked with Mr. Dennis Carlson, an HCS school board member and member of the Keuka Lake Association, to get the students involved in this valuable community service. Students completed these containers during the last week of the semester, and these containers will be stored until the town and/or village crews can place them this spring.

Glenn Curtiss Elementary 1st Annual "MOCK" Caldecott Medal Award Contest

Glenn Curtiss Elementary students participated in their first annual "Mock" Caldecott Medal Award contest during the month of January. The Randolph Caldecott Medal every year recognizes the prior year's *most distinguished American picture book for children*. Pre-K through 6th grade students learned about the Caldecott Medal during Library classes, and were read three picture books which included a variety of text and illustrations. The following week students were given the opportunity to vote on which book they thought deserved the Caldecott Medal. They chose from The Lonely Giant written and illustrated by Sophie Ambrose; The Day I Became a Bird written by Ingrid Chabbert and illustrated by Guridi; and The Uncorker of Ocean Bottles by



Michelle Cuevas and illustrated by Erin E. Stead. <u>The Lonely Giant</u> won the 2017 "Mock" Caldecott Award with 155 out of 310 votes. <u>The Day I Became a Bird came</u> in 2nd place with 104 votes, while <u>The Uncorker of Ocean Bottles</u> received 51 votes. This was an excellent opportunity to teach students about the roles of authors and illustrators, and how to be critical while examining the text and illustrations of a book as a whole.

During the month of January, our Leading Laker qualities focused on COM-MON COURTESY with a specific focus on greeting others, acknowledging greetings from others, and manners. Captain Laker posters have been placed throughout the building near locations where greetings take place such as the main entrance, the playground doors, the cafeteria, special area classes, etc. On each poster, Captain Laker has a speech bubble with a greeting for students. The goal was that teachers and staff would use these as checkpoints for



teaching and reinforcing appropriate responses to these greetings. For example: Captain Laker says "Good morning" and we say "Good morning Captain Laker"; Captain Laker says "Have a good night" and we say "You too, Captain Laker"; Captain Laker says "What would you like for lunch today?" and we say "A hamburger please" and "Thank you" when we get it. Captain Laker also made a few appearances before the end of the month to remind our students to use COMMON COURTESY every day! The need for these skills is so important for our Leading Lakers, and we know the consistency and reminders help them shine!
