



# in Upstate

Way to go, Lakers! Hammondsport students were ranked 4th in a listing of Upstate NY schools' SAT scores. While three local Steuben County schools made the Top 50 (Corning-

Painted Post ranked #9 and Horseheads ranked #47), Hammondsport students claimed the top spot for the county, with a combined score of 1,701.

The SAT, which was formerly known as the Scholastic Aptitude Test, is one of two major college admissions tests given in the US, along with the ACT.

The SAT uses three different tests to assess students' abilities. The Reading test evaluates the skills and knowledge at the heart of education by asking students to read and analyze 1) a piece of contemporary US or World Literature, 2) a passage or pair of passages from a US founding document or a great global conversation, 3) a selection from one of the social sciences and 4) two science based passages. The Writing and Language test examines students' ability to read, spot errors, and fix them as well as command of evidence, literary analysis, expression of ideas and use of words in context. The Math exam focus is on the heart of Algebra, problem solving and data analysis, geometry and trigonometry.

HCS students and faculty should all take pride in this accomplishment!

On June 3, Dr. Roald Hoffmann, a chemistry professor at Cornell University and survivor of the Holocaust, visited our fifth and sixth grade classes.
