Ciming High News from Hammondsport Central School District Superintendent Kyle Bower

HCS teachers and students continue to work very hard as they adjust to the new expectations of the Common Core Learning Standards in English Language Arts and mathematics. Since the Common Core is NOT a curriculum, the District is finalizing plans for a major curriculum writing initiative which will begin in the summer of 2014. While the State produced modules have provided teachers and students with examples of what the new standards may look like, we believe our educational professionals can create a better curriculum locally. Our goal is to begin the 2014-15 school year with a locally developed framework of lessons, units, and assessments that meet and exceed the rigor of what was produced as modules.

One area where we have heard concerns loud and clear is the need to develop materials in the area of resources for parents. We have many parents that want to help, but were never taught using the methods and strategies that are currently in place. Parent support is critical for the success of any student and we will work hard to make sure parents have the resources and tools they need to provide that support. Ideas of 'what would help the most' are always welcome!

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Coursework Coming to Hammondsport

Next year, Hammondsport will be implementing STEM coursework throughout the

District in an effort to better prepare our students for the 21st century through the integration of these critical disciplines. The mission of the STEM initiative throughout our region is to "revitalize and refocus attention, interest and understanding of the embedded importance of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) to life-long learning and success".

The chart below shows the sequence of units that will be presented in STEM grades 3-6. These units are aligned with the Common Core Learning Standards in math and will help reinforce the concepts the students are learning in that discipline as well. We are very excited to be offering this new and exciting opportunity to our students! (please see additional info. on p. 3)



From the desk of: Tad Rounds, 7–12 Principal

There is a lot to celebrate in this month's Laker Lines. Our Valedictorian Elizabeth Albright and Salutatorian Lori Gordon were announced as well as the top 10 in the Class of 2014. Our Boys' Varsity Basketball team won their first county championship since the inception of the tournament. Also, numerous students were selected for All County for both band and choir.

Last year Hammondsport Central Junior/Senior High School was ranked by *US News and World Report* as a "Top High School" in the nation. Our school was ranked 114th within New York State based upon ELA (English Language Arts) and math performance, and AP participation rate. This was the first silver medal awarded to the school despite three consecutive recognitions, because of the increased participation in AP (Advanced Placement) courses. To keep this positive momentum, access to honors courses has been extended to all students whose parents want to exercise the option. Access to college level course work or a skilled trade program prior to graduation from high school needs to be open to all students. The foundation for success in college level work is built in grades K-10 with a challenging curriculum for all with embedded supports. Please note the number of college level courses currently offered:

AP US History
AP/ Alfred University Calculus
AP/ACE Statistics
CLEP Spanish IV
ACE Accounting
AP Spanish V
ACE English
ACE Theater

In addition, ACE Economics will be offered in 2014/2015 school year through the Business Department and ACE Biology in the 2015/2016 school year. I recommend that all students and parents exercise the option of enrolling in honors and college level courses.

ELA (English Language Arts) exams for seventh and eighth grade students are on April 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. The math exams will commence on April 30th through May 2nd. We encourage all students to relax, get adequate rest and do their best. Although these exams are not used for retention purposes they will mirror the Regents assessments in later years and the College Board is revamping their SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) to reflect the curriculum taught and assessed in schools.
