I want to take the opportunity to thank our students for their adherence to our safety guidelines that we have put in place to maximize our ability to deliver in-person instruction during this time. I also want to commend our full remote students and temporary remote students for their dedication and responsibility engaging in instruction in the virtual environment.

Because of the flexibility and innovation of our staff in designing socially distanced instruction, we have been able to double the amount of in-person student teacher contact days, as opposed to the more common model being employed in other districts, which calls for two days of in-person instruction and three days of remote instruction. Also, our system allows for students to maintain the continuity of instruction in a virtual environment in the event of any school closure with minimal disruption to their daily schedule of courses. We are thankful to be back teaching our students, both in person and remotely!


### Glenn Curtiss Elementary Library Receives Grant for Audio Playaway Books

Our Glenn Curtiss library is proud to announce that we will be the recipient of a Dollar General Literacy Foundation grant in the amount of \$3,000. This grant will be spent entirely on audio Playaway books that are targeted at our students in grades 2-6. Playaway books are hand-held listening devices with books loaded in digital format. Students can simply plug in their headphones or earbuds to listen to the book or story being read aloud to them. Students can adjust the volume of the reader, and they can also adjust the speed of the reader (if they are following along with a print copy of the book).

Our students are very excited about the arrival of the Playaway order. Seventy-three new Playaways will be available to be checked out! A big thank you goes out to Mrs. Robarge who took the initiative to pursue this grant for our school — we can't wait to receive our new Playaway books!

## Respect, Responsibility, Safety, and Growth Mindset:

#### Transitioning Back to School with Our Four Leading Laker Expectations in Mind

Our teacher leaders on our Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) team spent time this summer preparing explicit lessons and accompanying materials to ensure our Curtiss staff had a consistent approach and common language around teaching our students how and why we wear masks and socially distance, as well as ensuring common language and expectations around handwashing. Our team was intentional in connecting these behaviors to our four Leading Laker expectations of respect, responsibility, safety, and growth mindset within these lessons. All teachers dedicated time at the start of the year to teaching these lessons for all students. A few examples are highlighted below.



Mask Wearing: Students learned that we wear our masks to show respect for others around us as we focus on keeping both others and ourselves safe. We all share the responsibility of remembering to have our mask with us at all times.



Social Distancing: Students learned that that six feet is about the length of one of our picnic tables, and the important responsibility of wearing a mask then we can't maintain that distance to keep others and ourselves safe.



Handwashing: Students learned explicit steps for proper handwashing and when it is important throughout our day. "Clean hands in 20" reminds us to wash our hands for a full 20 seconds.



#### The Overall Message

In addition to learning the how and the why behind these safety protocols, we focused intently on our responsibility to all work together to take care of our entire school family, and to show a growth mindset as we work through learning these routines together. The visuals you see are displayed throughout our classrooms and hallways as reminders of that commitment we all share together!



## **Steuben County Athletic Association Fall Season Statement**

The Steuben County Athletic Association is excited for the start of the fall season. To make this season as safe as possible, the districts that make up the league have agreed to follow protocols when competing against each other.

#### All athletes will wear masks during contests.

The recent uptick in COVID-19 cases in Steuben County is a good reminder that districts must stay vigilant in protecting students and ensuring their respective education programs can continue. The wearing of masks during contests will extend a best practice used in all school buildings to the field.

#### Only home team spectators will be allowed at contests.

New York State is still under a 50-person limit for non-essential gatherings. With many teams having close to 20 athletes, the 50-person limit will quickly be reached with two spectators per home team athlete. With no mechanism to quickly communicate capacity at a given location, limiting spectators to home teams will hopefully limit confusion and disappointment for all our fans.

If any restrictions imposed by New York State change, allowing for a change in league protocols, every district will quickly communicate information to their athletes and communities.
