In support of the Common Core Learning Standards, New York State is creating and releasing curriculum modules that districts can use as they prepare students for the new Common Core Assessments students will be required to take. The combination of the new State Standards, a District tailored curriculum aligned to the rigor of the new modules, and a new State assessment system, will increase the skills and abilities of our future graduates.

In an effort to provide a forum for discussion and the sharing of information, parents and interested community members are invited to a town hall meeting with District officials on Monday, November 4th, 2013 at 6:30pm in the District Auditorium. The focus of this meeting will be to answer questions and share information about the District implementation of the Common Core. We hope to see everyone there!

### Hammondsport Central School District (HCSD) Board of Education (BOE) Sets Objectives for 2013/2014

As with any individual, group, team or organization, it is virtually impossible to move forward and achieve a desired outcome without objectives.

For the 2013/14 school year, the HCSD BOE is making no exception to this rule and has established four objectives focused on areas that are of high importance to our students, educators and parents and community.

The Objectives established by the Board are as follows:

- 1. Research and assess the financial and curricular implications of long term (approximately 5 years) district organizational options as influenced by projections of declining enrollment and increasing costs
- 2. Implement a system to recognize exceptional performance within the school community
- 3. Investigate opportunities to make early learning available to all District residents
- 4. Independently communicate to the school community the Board's position on high priority issues within the District

Ironically enough, it is the fourth Objective that has prompted this communication. It is the intention of the HCSD BOE that you will frequently see communications directly from the Board as we move forward with our Objectives and high priority issues.

### Information from the **Transportation Department:**

#### Messages to the kids:

- 1. Never cross close to the front of the bus make sure the driver can see you.
- 2. Never pick up anything you drop close to or under the bus ask the driver what to do.
- 3. Never run after a bus or bang on the side.
- 4. If you must cross the street in front of the bus, follow the driver's directions, and stop and look before you cross.
- 5. Never run across a street, it's better to miss the bus than rush and risk being hit by a car.
- 6. Stay away from the rear and sides of the bus always be in a safe place where the driver can see you.

#### Messages to the motoring public

- 1. Never pass a school bus when its stop lights are flashing.
- 2. Be extra vigilant around school hours assume a child might run out at any moment.
- 3. Be courteous to school buses, give them room and let them change lanes when they need to.
