It was great to see the smiles on teachers' faces when students walked through the doors on opening day! Change and increased academic expectations will be a common theme for the foreseeable future.

Last year's 7th and 8th grade students were the first to be exposed to the new exams aligned with the Common Core Standards in ELA (English Language Arts) and math. This year's algebra students and 11th grade ELA (English Language Arts) students will be the first cohort of students that will take Regents exams aligned with the Common Core Standards. For this school year only students will be required to take both the Common Core Regents and the traditional Regents exam and keep the higher of the scores. These Common Core exams are much more difficult and require distinct skill sets to demonstrate proficiency.

The English department and math department are utilizing the grade level curriculum modules as they become available. The ELA (English Language Arts) curriculum has reading passages and selections that are and will be controversial. However, these are the central readings upon which the individual lessons and assessments are derived. Parents are reminded that real time student performance information can be accessed by creating a Parent Portal account. The link can be accessed through the district's web address.

The senior class will be departing for their senior trip to Boston on October 11<sup>th</sup> and Homecoming is scheduled for the weekend of October 18<sup>th</sup>. The pep assembly will commence the weekend, followed by the varsity girls' soccer and volleyball game. Please come out to support the Hammond-sport Lakers!

# Board of Education August 2013 Meeting Highlights

## Curtiss School Still on the Market

The sale of the Curtiss School building to developer Robert Lack has been terminated by the buyer. Citing that proposed financing for the project was withdrawn, Mr. Lack notified the District by letter on Wednesday, September 11<sup>th</sup> that the transaction was terminated immediately.

Since the school first went on the market in 2010, the School Board has accepted three purchase offers for the building. The first deal with the Town of Urbana was terminated following a public vote against the transaction. The second deal with Mr. Simon Sananas was terminated in 2012.

Since first listing the building for sale, the District has spent approximately \$100,000 in legal fees and carrying costs while seeking a buyer. The District's current real estate broker, Realty USA, continues to market the property and hopes to have purchase offers to present to the Board of Education at its regular meeting on October 16<sup>th</sup>.



# **ATTENTION TAXPAYERS**

This is a reminder that for both service and safety reasons, school taxes will **no longer** be collected at the Main Street School. If you wish to pay your school taxes in person, payment should be brought to the Five Star Bank on Shethar Street in the Village of Hammondsport. Five Star Bank is open Monday-Wednesday from 9 am - 4 pm, Thursday and Friday from 9 am - 5 pm, and Saturday from 9 am to 12 pm.

For taxpayers paying by mail, payments should be sent to: Five Star Bank, PO Box 14, Warsaw, NY 14569. School tax payment information and receipts can be printed by accessing the School Tax portal through the District website at www.hammondsportcsd.org.

Reminder: The District no longer has a post office box. No information or tax bills should be sent to PO Box 368. The mailing address for the District is 8272 Main Street Ext, Hammondsport, NY 14840.

The District Tax Collector, Mrs. Jerry Scott, will be in the District on Tuesdays and Thursdays between the hours of 9 am - 3 pm if you have any questions or concerns. Her phone number is 569-5200 ext. 5243. All of the above information is also noted on all tax bills.

#### REGISTER FOR NYS STAR SCHOOL PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

All NYS homeowners receiving a Basic STAR property tax exemption must register with the NYS Tax Department in order to receive the STAR exemption in 2014 and subsequent years.

All Basic STAR recipients will receive registration instructions by mail.
